## **CZECH ROWING INTRODUCTION**

#### **Basic Statistics**

- The Czech Rowing Association was founded in 1884, the first rowing club was founded in 1860
- 40 rowing clubs in CZE, 2 of them are focused on Para-rowers
- Cca 4.000 members (1.800 of them are 11-18yrs)
- 3 high performance centres (Army, Police, Ministry)



## **CZECH ROWING INTRODUCTION**

#### **Basic Facts - pros**

- intl. successful compare to the other sports in CZE (OG, WCH, JWCH).
- Best CZE rowers are local celebrities like O. Synek, M. Knapková, V. Chalupa.
- Rowing in the Czech Republic is not an "upper class" sport.
- Federation and clubs are relatively well financially supported by the Ministry of Education & Sports, regional and local governments.



## **CZECH ROWING INTRODUCTION**

#### **Basic Facts – cons**

- Small number of clubs and rowers (in GER is 50x more).
- No tradition in "rowing-for-all", no specific non-competitive clubs.
- No tradition in university rowing, no specific university clubs.
- ② Almost all rowers are "competitive", very small part are "hobby" rowers.



### **CZECH ROWING CHALLENGE**

Rowing has new "enemies" like new sports, ageing of population, etc. and we must face them.

- Currently the facilities in CZE are at close to capacity so are becoming a limiting factor for future growth in competitive rowing.
- We recognize two main strategies for the widening of the CZE community rowing base.
  - Indoor rowing we already have a separate development programme
  - Non competitive & academic rowing big challenge.



# CZECH ROWING CHALLENGE NON-COMPETITIVE ROWING

#### Two examples of how to "cross the border"

- Case study I. New activity in a traditional boathouse

  TJ Bohemians Praha
- Case study II. Newly founded rowing club, but a "little different" VBK Lipno, Václav Chalupa



#### Case study I. – Basic facts

- A special department for newcomers and hobby rowers founded two members of TJ Bohemians Praha
- They started in 2011 with 6 rowers, in 2018 they cater for about 60 rowers
- 60% of them are women, mostly 30-40yrs
- two full time coaches + helpers



#### **Case study I. - Financial issues**

- The project is not dependent on public funds.
- All sport activities of "hobby" group are covered by members themselves
- They pay 15 Euros / lesson, i.e. cca 100 150 Euros / month
- Facilities and boats they hire from the original rowing club Bohemians.









Case study I. - How to cross the border

Daniel Chalupa (no relations with Václav), head of the project:

"The key to success was to show people that **rowing is not just about racing** and everyday hard training"

"They love to train **for fun**, to be part of group of similar people"





Case study I. - How to cross the border

Daniel Chalupa, head of the project:

"Look at that inspiring man — **Aleš Nejedlo**. He is 53, he started to row just three years ago in our group of newcomers. He has no previous competitive sport experience. This year he was the **first** man who rowed **from Prague to Hamburg i**n a single scull in 12 days!"

"He is a great example for everyone, that rowing is the right choice, no matter how old are you."











#### **Case study II. - Basic Facts**

- Václav Chalupa completely changed his mind and priorities. He relocated with his family from Račice to Lipno in 2016. Lipno is the largest artificial lake in the CZE.
- He built a new boathouse in cooperation with the mayor of Lipno city.
- He established the Rowing & Ice skating Club Lipno in 2017.
- Because of rough water and windy conditions he use mostly coastal boats.



#### Case study II. - Financial issues

- They founded the club without a public money!
- The boathouse racks, boats, oars and equipment was paid by Vaclav and the mayor of Lipno.
- They share the indoor facilities with Yacht club Lipno.
- Regular members pay 30 Euros for first 4 entry lessons, then 15 Euros monthly.
- Hobby rowers pay 20 Euros / hour including equipment.



























### **CONCLUSION**

From our experience, some recommendations for success.

- Find and choose the right people with a positive energy 80% is done.
- Money is usually not the main barrier to go further.
- The role of the Federation is mainly to encourage and help rather than direct and control.
